If Abraham was the father of faith Sarah is the mother. Counted among the heroes of faith in Hebrews chapter 11 Sarah is remembered and memorialized as a woman who believed God. She didn't just believe in God she believed what He said!

Even as I write this my heart is deeply stirred with a yearning to live a life that is dramatically marked by "believing God."

How about you? Is something in your heart stirred when you consider the implications of living a life marked by stepping out onto the waters of faith, at the word of the Lord, to discover over and over again the unchanging faithfulness of God?

However, as we shall soon see, Sarah did not begin her journey with mountain-moving faith. Her story, like ours, had a beginning, middle, and an end. Her faith grew over time and through the experience of walking with God. Her journey from barrenness to becoming a faith-filled woman who gave birth to a miracle child was a process. As we trace her journey over the next 5 weeks we shall see her story is filled with the rawness of human weaknesses combined with the faithfulness of God. In fact, the hero of this story is not Sarah or Abraham but God! Without Him, there could be no miracle and the same is true for us.

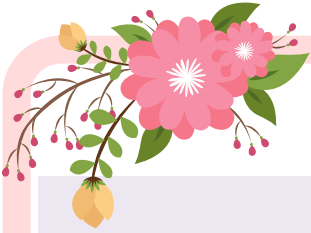
Hebrews 11:11 is the theme verse for our study of Sarah. So today, I want you to begin by taking some time with this passage. On the following page, you will find an outline to- read it, write it, say it, apply it, and pray it. This will be a model that we will use frequently throughout this study, so I have it outlined for reference below.

- Read it: Read aloud the specified passage.
- Write it: Write out the entire verse.
- Say it: Rephrase the passage in your own words.
- Apply it: How will you respond? What will you do?
- Pray it: Record your prayer confirming your response.

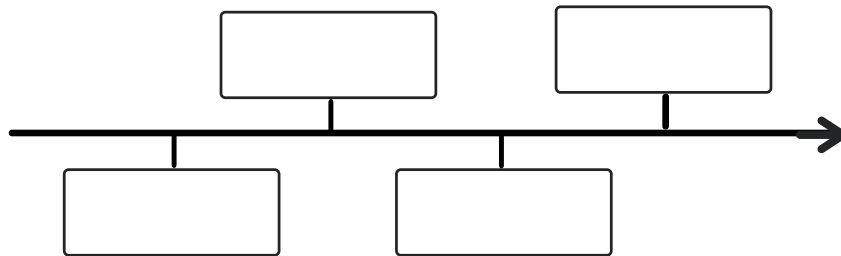

God often uses the journey to prepare us for the miracle. Sarah's (formerly Sarai) journey to conceiving and giving birth to a miracle child was a long one (approximately 25 years) with various stages. Today I want us to take a little time to look at the first stage of her journey with Abraham.

Stage One of Sarah's Journey

1. Read Genesis 11:31 – 12:7
2. Then on the timeline below write down in sequential order the names of the 4 locations we are given that Abram and Sarai traveled.
3. Now read Acts 7:2-4.
4. Using the information from both passages draw a cloud on the timeline of when God appeared to Abram. (note Ur is in Mesopotamia)



As you can see in this first stage each move was marked by an encounter with God.

“I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go;
I will counsel you with my loving eye on you.”

In closing write out a prayer to God thanking Him for His faithfulness to lead you in the way you should go:

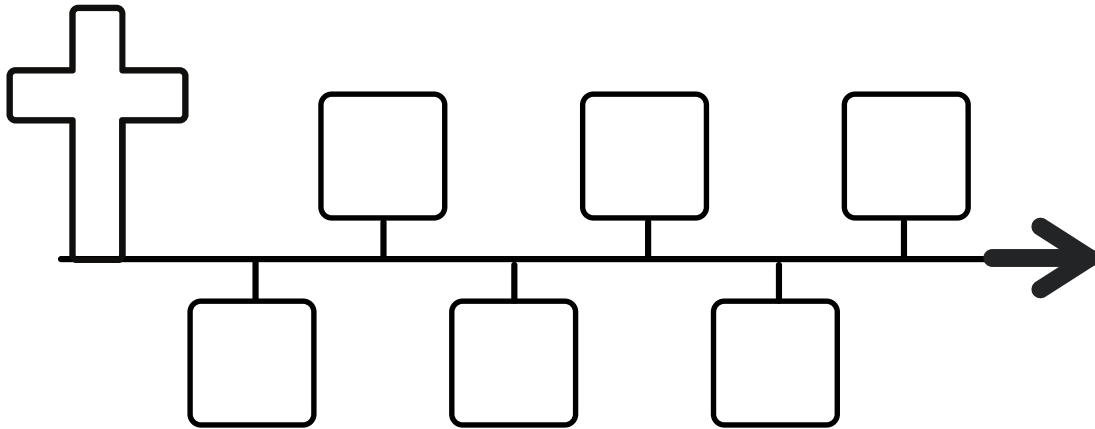
Today I want us to close out our study for this week by taking some time to reflect on God's faithfulness to lead you to where you are presently. 1. Looking at the timeline below I want you to think about your personal journey with the Lord up to this point. Beginning with when you first heard the call of God to follow Him write the date or how old you were in the cross at the beginning of the timeline. (If you have never made the decision to surrender your life to Christ please read through the last page)
2. Write the current date at the end of the timeline where the arrow is located.
3. List in sequential order any life-shaping, course-altering circumstances you have had with the Lord on your journey. This might be trials you have walked through, memorable answers to prayer, unexpected blessings, peace in a storm, provisions etc.
 - a. Write the number for each occurrence in the boxes on the timeline and then record a brief description on the line below next to the corresponding number.
4. Using the lined paper on the following page write a letter expressing your gratefulness to God for His faithfulness to you.

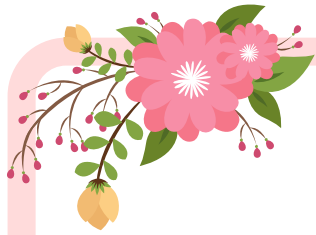

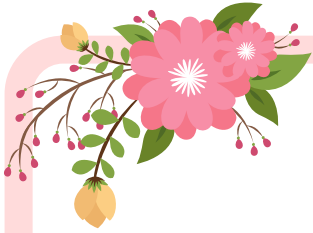

Deciding To Follow Jesus

Choosing to receive Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior is not only the most important decision but the best decision you will ever make.

The Word of God says,

“if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.”

Romans 10:9-10

“For whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.” Romans 10:13

The grace of God, given to us in Jesus Christ, has already done everything to provide salvation. Your part is simply to believe and receive.
